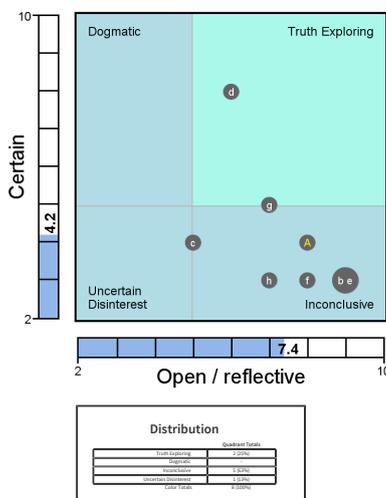

The Team Paradox Report enables a comprehensive understanding of your team's dynamics, strengths, potential conflicts, and development needs. It also enables leaders to better understand the impact of their own behaviors and better interact with the team.

Understanding This Report

This report enables you to see the scores for all the team members on one page for each paradox. Each team member's score is plotted on the graph using a letter within a circle. If more than one team member has the same score, the circle will have multiple letters.

The letters can be uppercase or lowercase to provide additional insight. For example, you could use uppercase to identify the team leader and lowercase for team members. Or you could use uppercase for a technical group and lowercase for a sales group. This provides important insights to improve the interactions between the two groups.

The Distribution table at the bottom of each graph shows the percentage and total number of team members within each paradox quadrant. This can be a useful summary to better understand team dynamics.

A table on the last page of this report identifies team members with their code letter. It is much more productive if team members share their code letters in the session. However, by not printing or revealing the last page, they can be anonymous.

Before Your Team Building Session

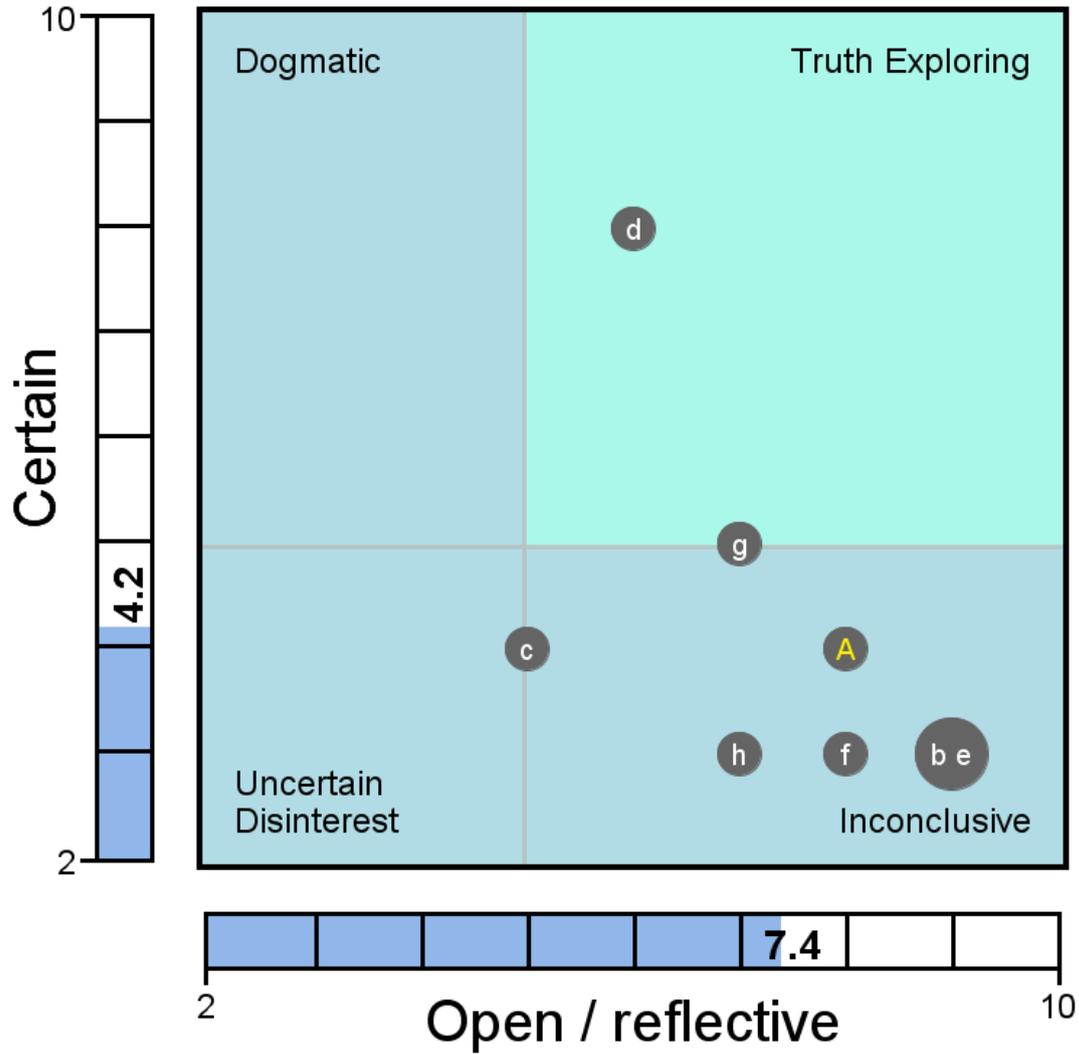
- Complete the Harrison Employee Development Course which includes a section on how to use the Team Paradox report for team building.
- Individually meet with each team member. Explore their view of the team's effectiveness and debrief them on their Paradox Report.
- Ask for their agreement to share their paradox scores in the team session.
- Plan the team building session based on their feedback and Team Paradox.

When facilitating the team session follow these guidelines:

- State the goals of the session.
- Summarize trends from the individual discussions.
- Identify or verify team goals.
- Discuss the team's paradoxical strengths.
- Explain each paradox and discuss how their scores apply.
- Discuss the impact of their behaviors and development needed.
- Summarize their insights from the discussions.
- Discuss and list specific actions to move the team forward.

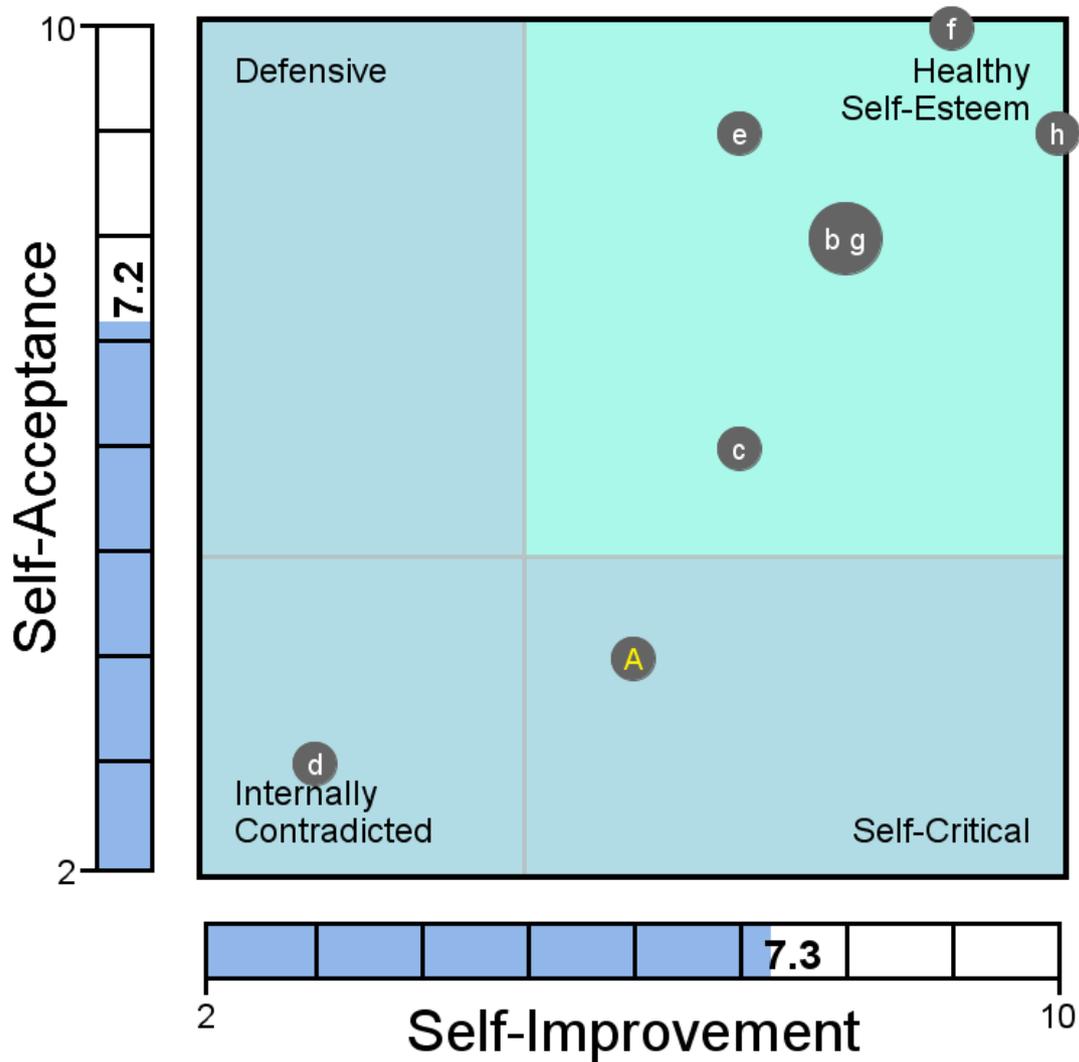

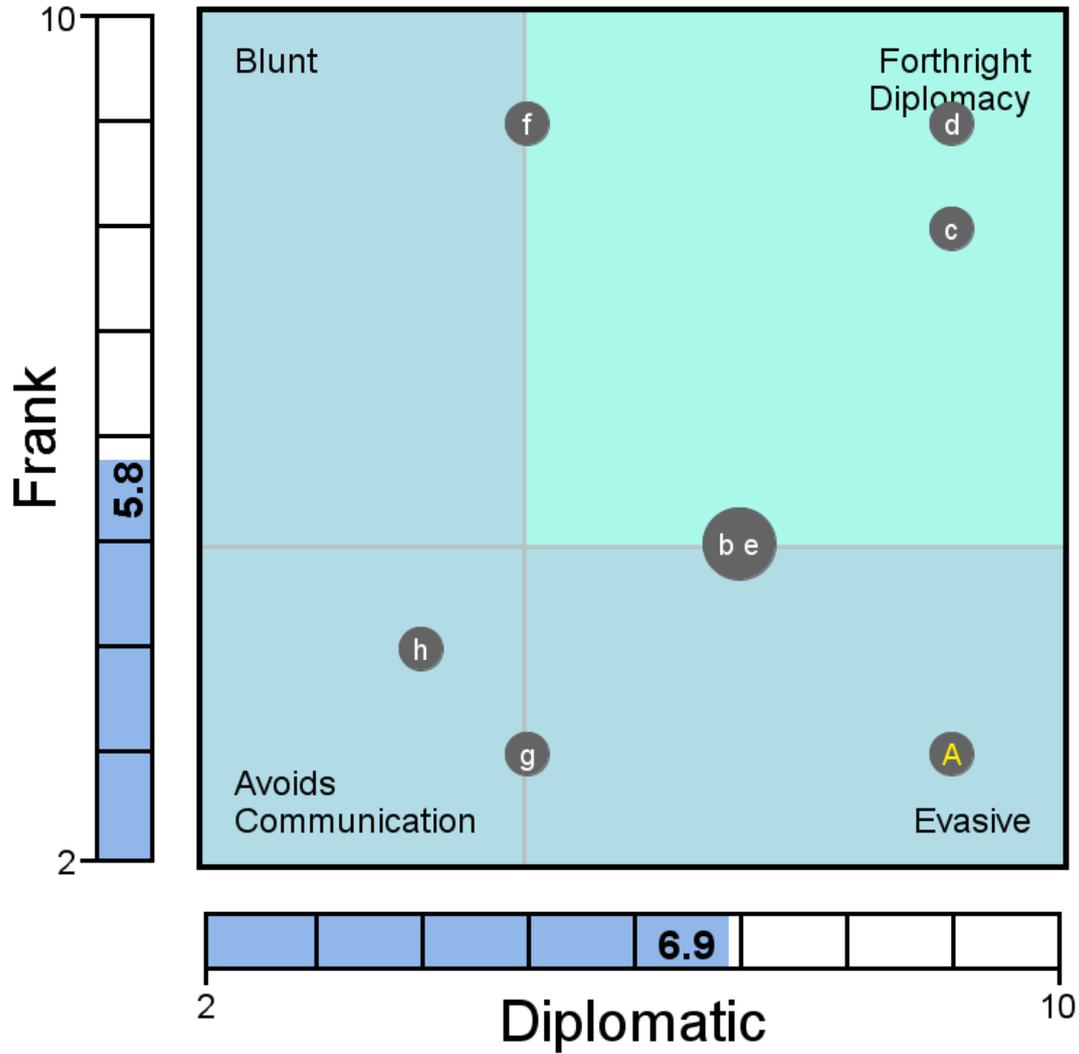

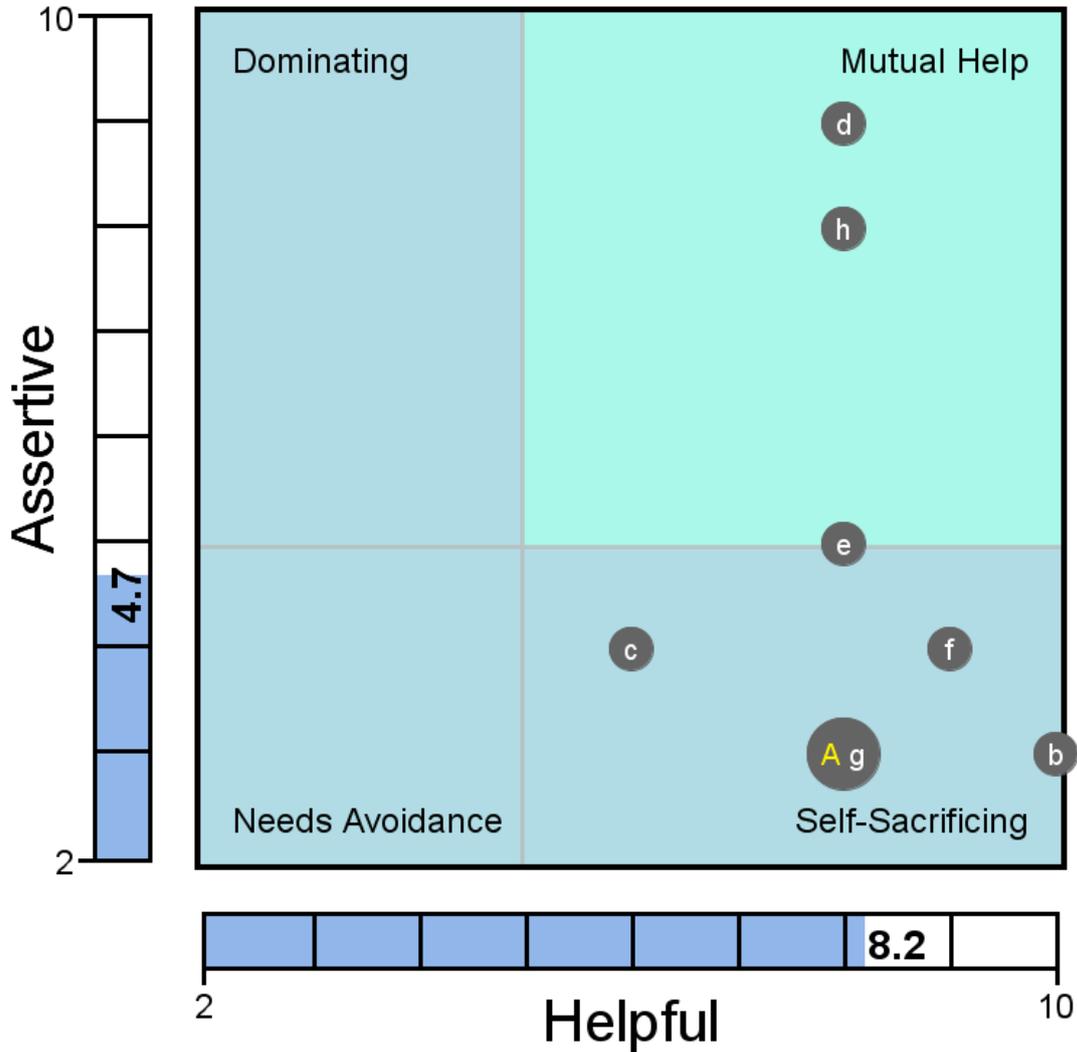

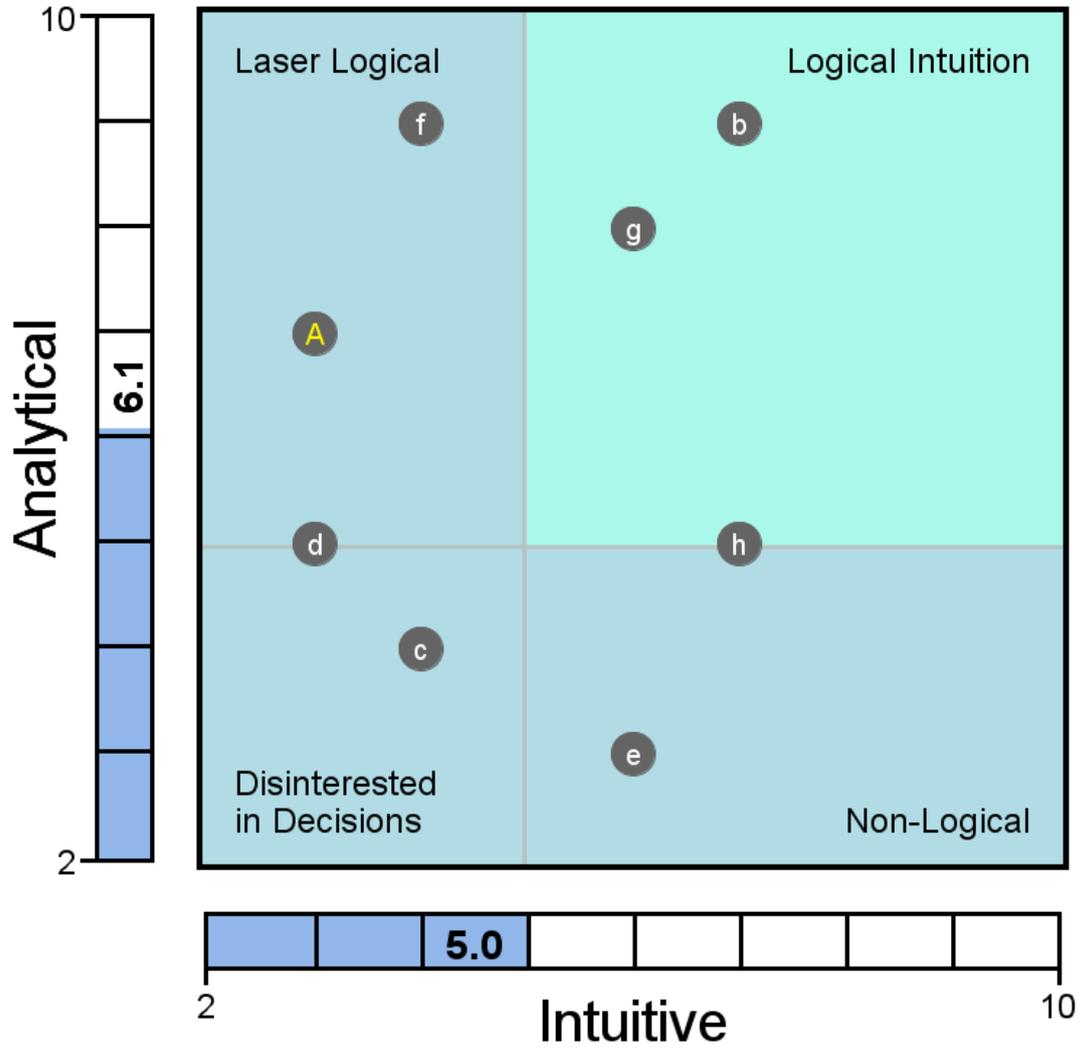

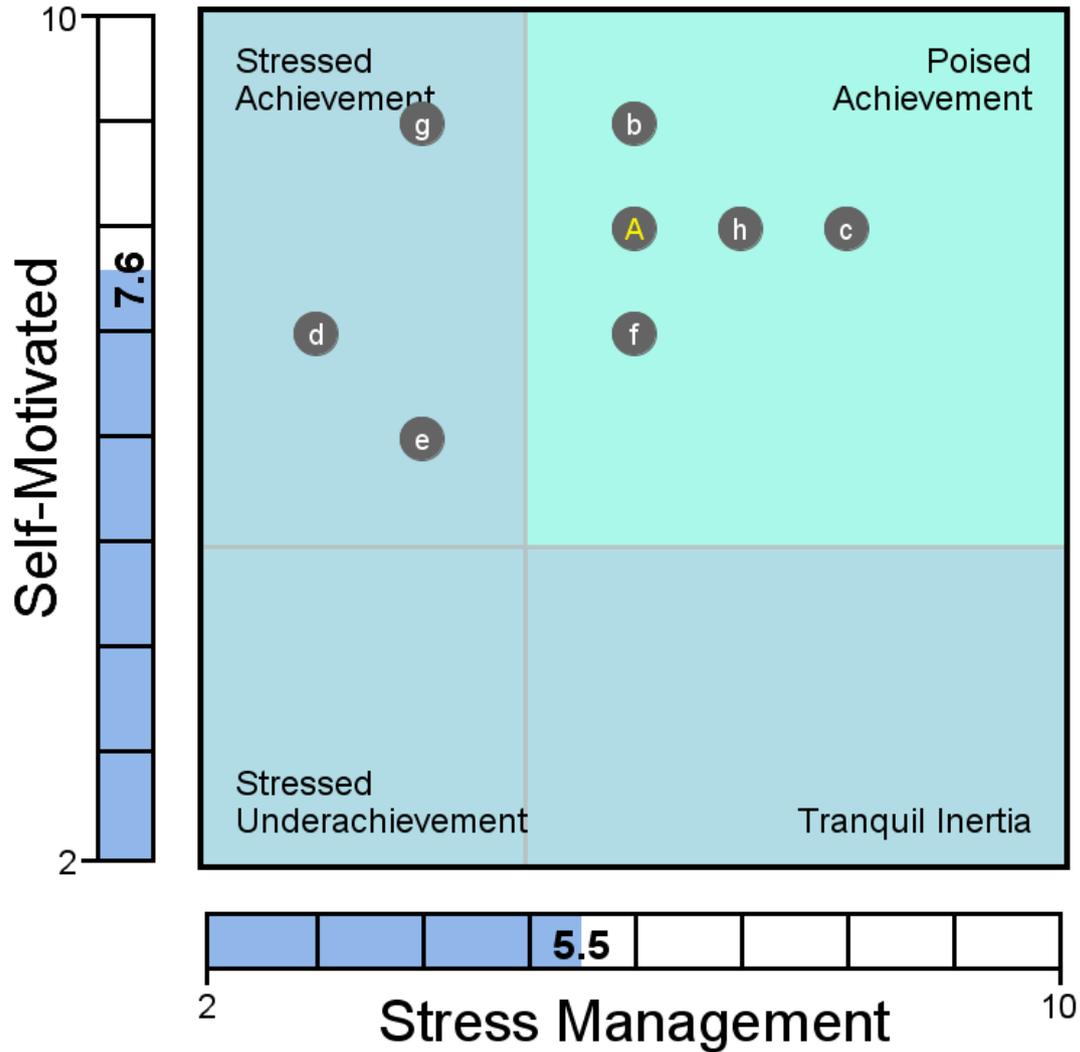

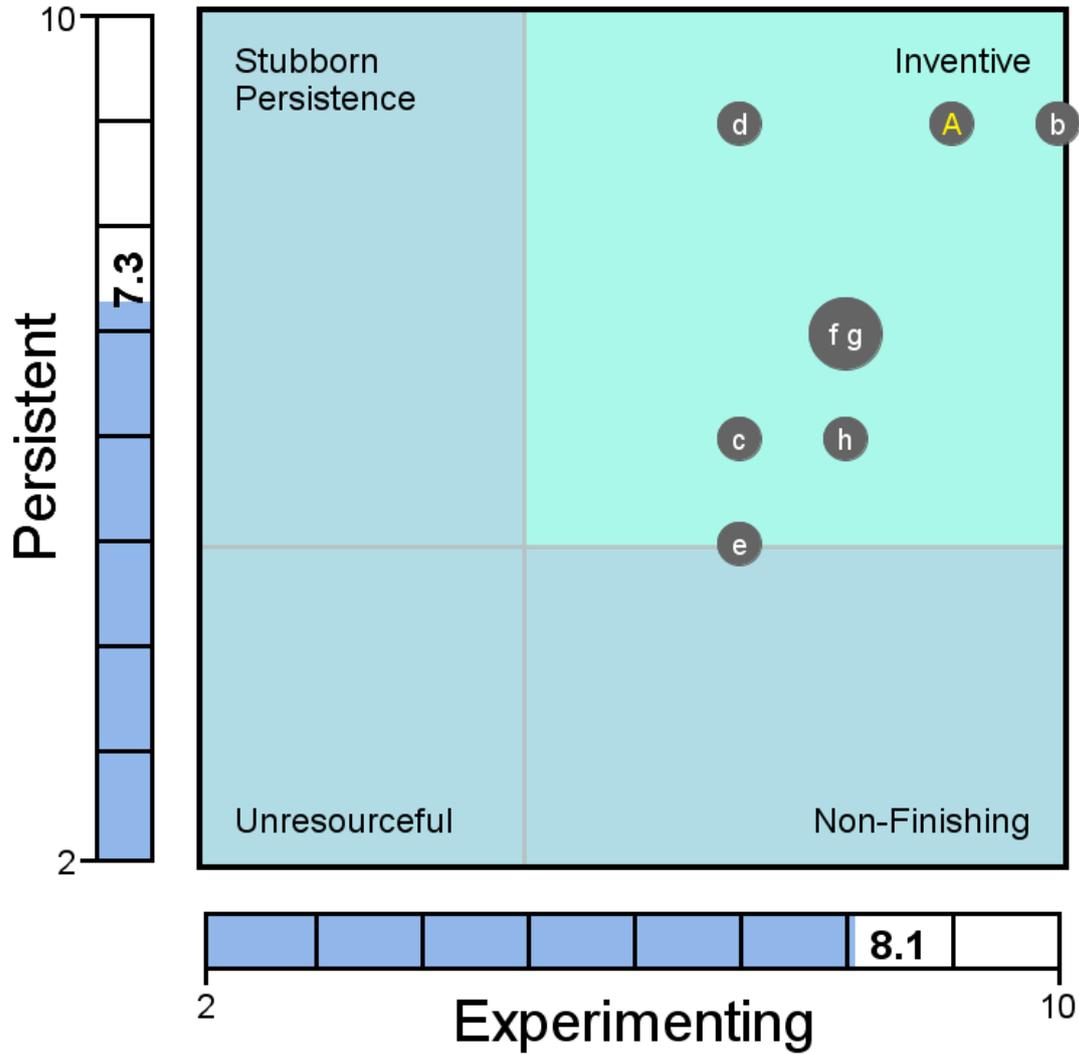

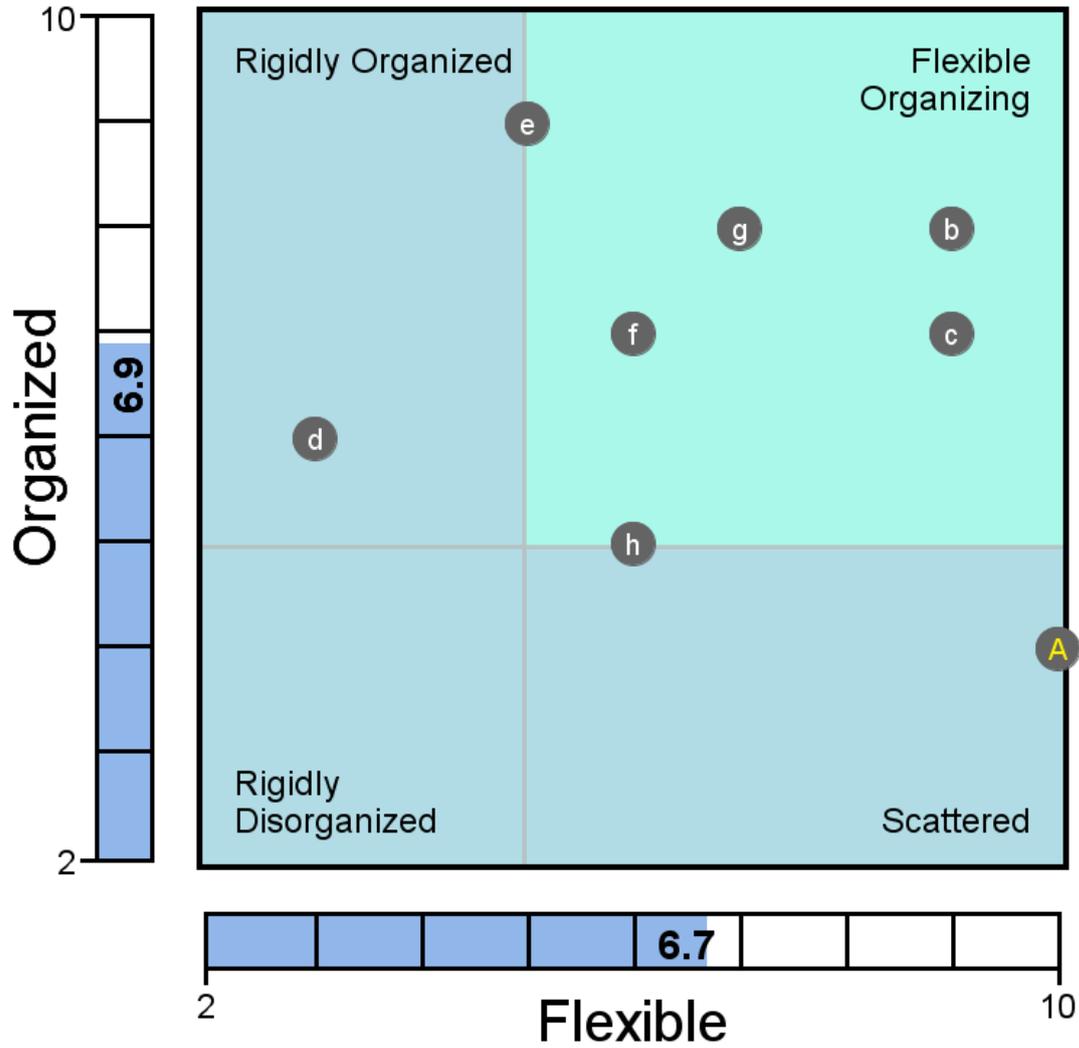

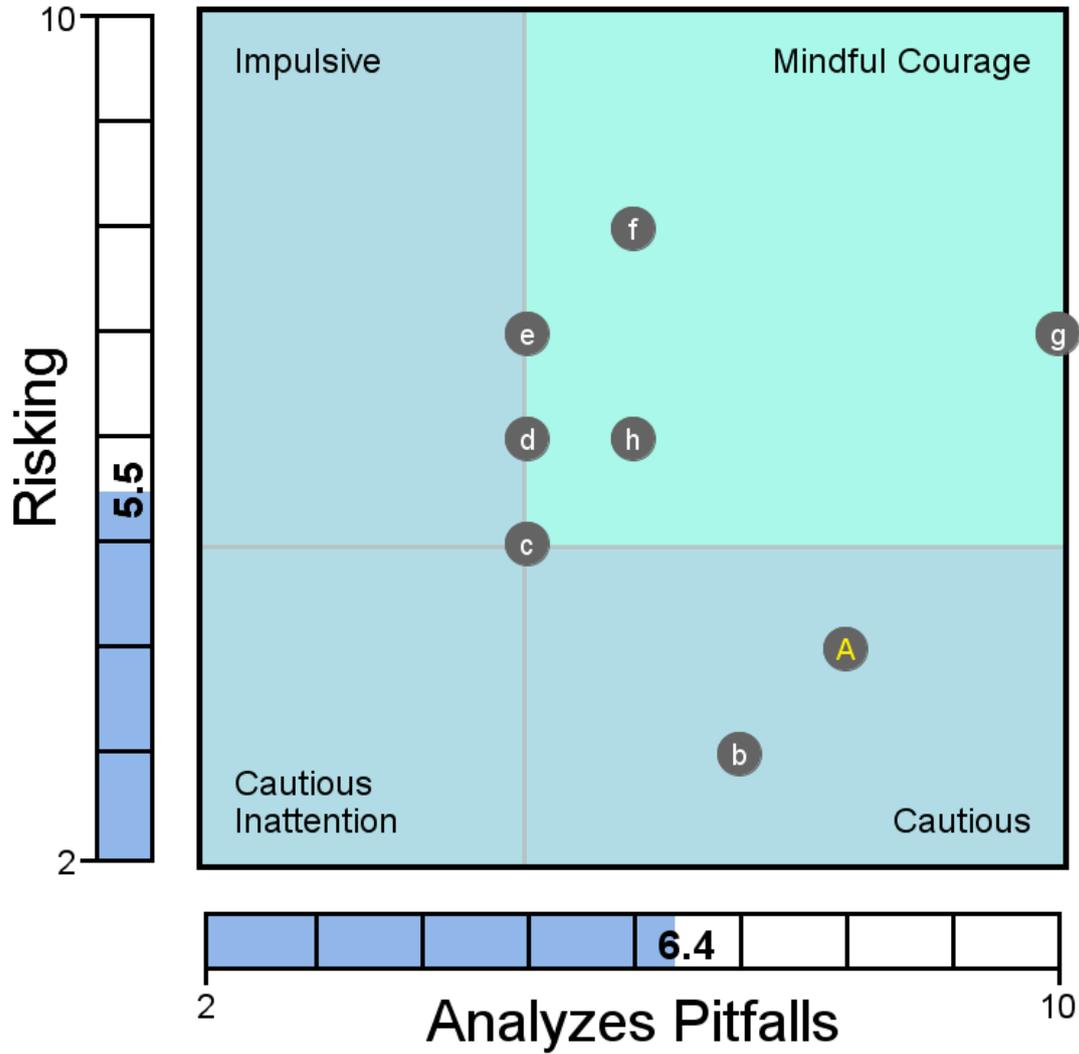

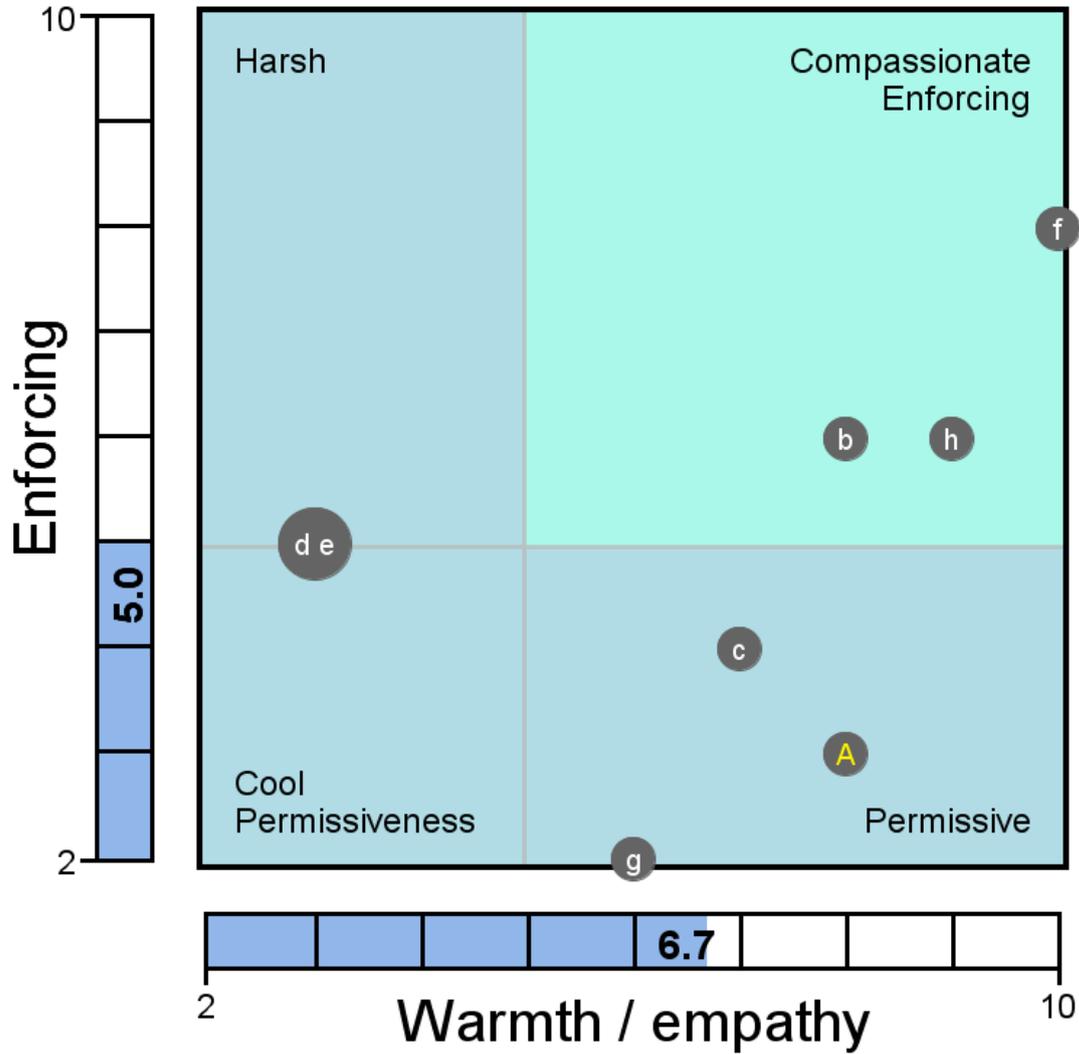

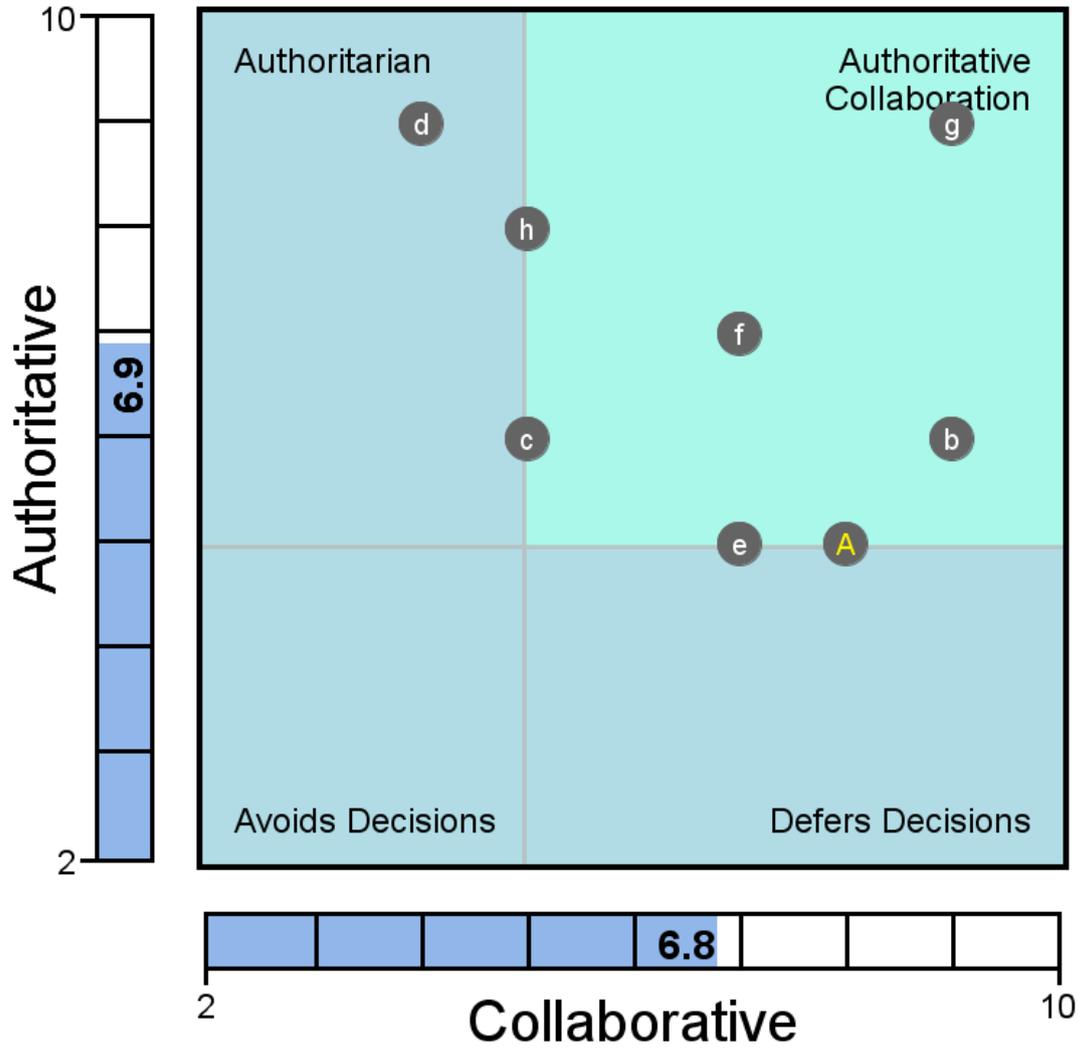

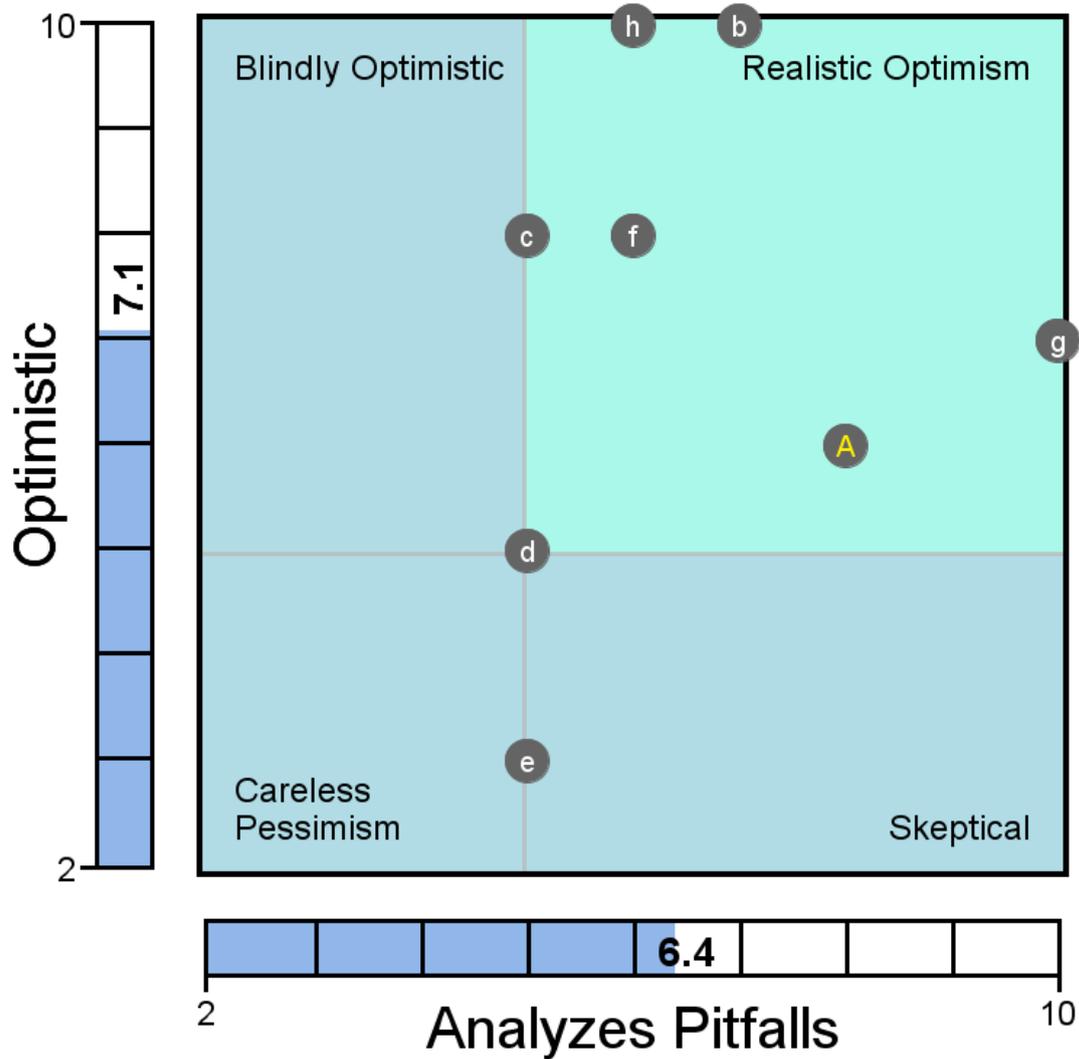
