Course Overview

The literature courses of the Sahab Writing Academy are designed to help participants develop their potential as writers. The courses are delivered by published authors and educational specialists.

At Sahab Collective, we believe writing fiction is both a craft and a conversation. Our twelve-week course is designed for adults who are serious about producing literary fiction that connects, challenges, and endures. Here, writing is not an act of isolation but of communication—an art that begins with intention and comes alive in the presence of readers.

Guided by an experienced educator and published author, this workshop invites participants to explore the structures, voices, and theories that shape contemporary storytelling. Through academic inquiry, literary analysis, and close practice, each session leads participants through rigorous discussion, sustained reading, and constructive peer critique.

This is not just a writing course. It is a studio for developing consequence on the page. You will study short and long forms, dissect narrative architecture, and explore how desire, perspective, and voice shape a reader's experience. Whether you are writing realism, fantasy, or experimental fiction, our course equips you to write with precision, awareness, and artistic integrity.

You will:

- Engage with literary and theoretical perspectives that deepen the craft of fiction—from Bakhtin's dialogism to Kristeva's intertextuality, from Freud's interior landscapes to Barthes' reader-response.
- Analyse how writers such as Virginia Woolf, Toni Morrison, and Italo Calvino construct character, time, and emotion through language.
- Learn to design narrative structure, refine voice, and create fiction that invites, challenges, and rewards the reader.
- Produce a polished manuscript extract, a critical reflection, and prepare your work for submission or publication.
- Join a vibrant community of writers committed to literary practice, collaboration, and shared readership.

In line with Sahab Collective's ethos, this course is rooted in the belief that writing flourishes through community and critical engagement. Writers will build an industry-standard portfolio, with eligible work published in the Sahab Collective Journal and presented at seasonal events.

Whether you are an emerging author, educator, or writer returning to your craft, this course offers both the structure and reflection needed to move from private intention to public authorship.

At Sahab, we believe you do not need more motivation—you need readers. This course provides them.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the cost of the course?

The course fee is AED 2,500.

What's included?

- 12 in-person seminar sessions (3 hours each).
- A curated academic reading pack shared weekly, and a reading list of selected fiction.
- Two private workshopping sessions with personalised feedback.
- An opportunity for publication in the Sahab Collective Journal, provided the following are met:
 - A final creative piece and accompanying critical commentary are submitted.
 - The work is respectful and culturally appropriate within the context of the UAE
 - Active participation in the course community

What's not included?

Participants are expected to provide their own writing materials and to source the recommended fictional texts independently. Reading these is strongly encouraged in order to fully engage in discussions and maximise the benefit of each session.

What's the idea behind this course?

This is the course we wish we had when we began our creative journeys: an alternative to a university-led MA in creative writing, with the same depth of academic engagement and the added intimacy of a committed creative community. Rooted in the mission of Sahab Collective—to empower artists through collaboration and critical growth—the Writing Academy is designed to feel like a professional and personal home for your writing.

Is this the right course for me?

This course is for you if:

- You want to be part of a thoughtful and supportive community
- You're ready to invest time in your growth as a writer
- You're open to collaboration and peer feedback
- You're serious about refining your voice, craft, and purpose

How much time should I expect to commit each week?

Each weekly seminar runs for three hours. In addition, you should plan for around seven hours of independent work per week. This includes reading assigned texts, writing your own creative work, and preparing for in-class discussions and workshops.

Where does the course take place?

Sessions are held at Al Safa Art & Design Library, within the activities hall and auditorium. For those who cannot attend in person, an online format is available.

Will I receive accreditation?

Upon completion, participants receive a certificate of completion. If your final creative piece is submitted and accepted for publication in the Sahab Collective Journal, you'll also be invited to present your work and reflect on your process at a seasonal showcase event, where you'll receive a published copy of the journal.

What are the objectives of the course?

The course aims to:

- Develop your literary voice and stylistic confidence.
- Provide a platform for publication.
- Enable you to critically position your work alongside contemporary children's literature.
- You'll complete a 5,000-word creative piece and a reflective commentary, equipping you with material suitable for submissions to agents or further development into a novel.

I'm not sure what kind of writing I want to pursue—picture books or young adult fiction!

This course is perfect for you. We explore the full spectrum of children's literature—from picture books to young adult fiction—so you can discover your natural fit or expand your interests. A broad foundation often leads to more confident, purposeful writing.

I'm already published or have an agent. Is this course still worth it?

That depends on what you're hoping to achieve. If you're seeking time, structure, and a stimulating community to deepen your practice, expand your critical perspective, or begin a new project with fresh energy, then this course offers tremendous value. It's a space to grow—whether you're just beginning or looking to recalibrate as a writer.
